# **Accelerated Irrigation Benefit Programme (AIBP)**

- The AIBP was launched in the year 1996-97 in the J&K state with a funding pattern of 75:25 basis (75% Loan assistance & 25% matching State Share).
- □ During 2005-06 the loan assistance was converted into grants by MOWR, Govt. of India.
- The funding pattern between Govt. of India and State Govt. Changed from 75:25 to 90:10 in the year 2006-07.
